Jeremiah 20:10-13, Psalm 68(69):8-10,14,17,33-35, Romans 5:12-15.  
GOSPEL READING: Matthew 10:26-33

*Meditation: What does fear have to do with the kingdom of God? Fear is a powerful force. It can lead us to panic and flight or it can spur us to faith and action. The fear of God is the antidote to the fear of losing one's life. I sought the Lord, and he answered me, and delivered me from all my fears. O fear the Lord, you his saints, for those who fear him have no want! Come, O sons, listen to me, I will teach you the fear of the Lord. (Psalm 34:4,9,11)*

### **Godly fear, reverence, and respect for God's ways produce wisdom**

**and right judgment:** What is godly fear? It is reverence for the One who made us in love and who sustains us in mercy and kindness. The greatest injury or loss which we can experience is not physical but spiritual - the loss of one's heart, mind, and soul to the power of hell. A healthy fear of God leads to spiritual maturity, wisdom and right judgment and it frees us from the tyranny of cowardly fear and sinful pride that refuses to do what is right, good, and just - especially in the face of opposition and evil. Do you trust in the power of God's love and truth that can conquer every fear and form of evil and wrongdoing? The Lord Jesus willingly embraced the cross for our sake to atone for our sins and to free us from slavery to sin, Satan, and death. Do you believe in the power of his cross and victory over death, despair, and sin?



### **Proclaim boldly what no earthly power can destroy - the cross and resurrection of Jesus Christ**

When Jesus proclaimed the kingdom of God he met opposition and hostility from those who refused to believe in him. He tells his disciples that they must expect the same treatment if they are to live and to proclaim the reign of God. There is both a warning and a privilege in his statement. Just as Jesus had to carry his cross, so the disciples must carry their cross and not try to evade it. To suffer for the faith is to share in the work of Christ. As one hymn states: Lift high the Cross of Christ! Tread where his feet have trod. The Holy Spirit gives us power and grace to live as disciples of Jesus Christ. Do you trust in God's grace to carry your cross for Jesus' sake?

[Fear not, you are of more value than many sparrows, by John Chrysostom, 344-407 A.D.](#)

*"What do you see in creation of less value than a tiny sparrow? But even the sparrow will not fall without God's knowledge. Jesus does not mean that the sparrow falls by God's direct will because it is unworthy but that nothing that occurs is hidden from God. If then God is not ignorant of anything that happens in creation, and if God loves us more truly than the best human father, and if God loves us so as to have numbered our very hairs, then we need not be afraid. Jesus said this not to indicate that God literally has a number placed on the very hairs of our head but rather to show that God has perfect knowledge of everything about us and providentially cares for everything about us. Therefore, if God both knows all things that happen to us and is able to save us and willing to do so, then whatever we may be suffering, we need not think that God has forsaken us in our suffering. For it is not God's will to keep us wholly separated from that which elicits dread but rather to persuade us not to make an idol out of whatever we dread. It is this, more than anything else, that constitutes deliverance from dread. 'Therefore, don't be afraid. You are of more value than many sparrows.' Don't you see that God views your fear with more concern than the lives of many sparrows? He already knows the secrets of your heart. Hence Jesus adds, 'Do not fear.' For even if that which you dread prevails, it prevails only over your body; this is the limited part of yourself, which nature will surely take in due time and bring to an end." (excerpt from The Gospel of Matthew, Homily 34, 2-3)*

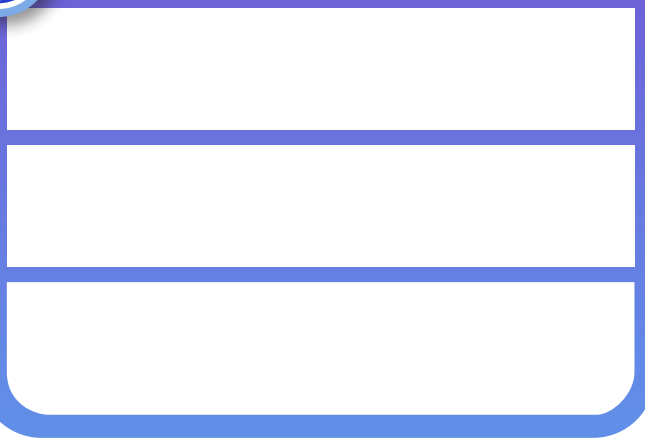

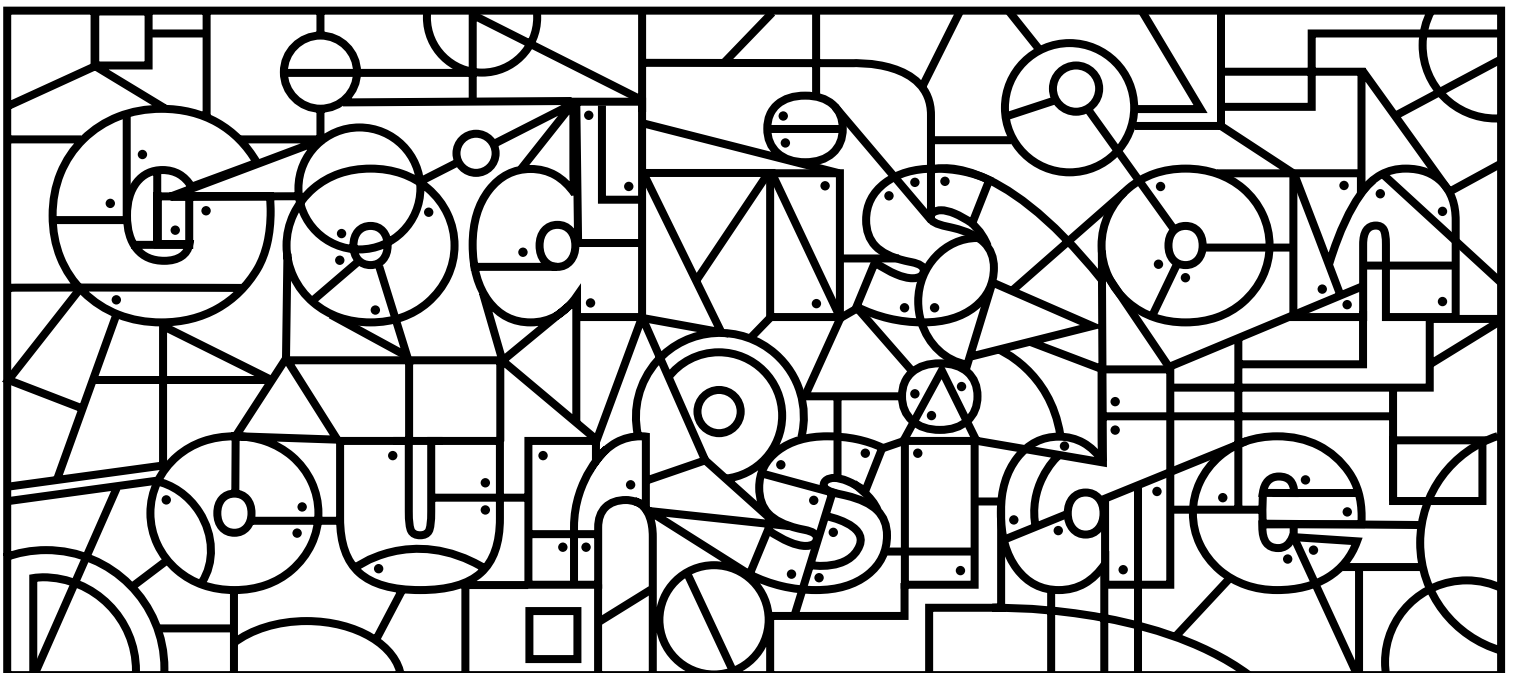
What are some things that people are afraid of?

## READINGS AND REFLECTIONS

Blind Italian tenor Andrea Bocelli once commented: *Stage fright is my worst problem. A voice is very intimate. It's something of your own. So there's always this fear, because you feel naked. There's a fear of not reaching up to expectations.* Singing in public is putting himself on the line!

As Jesus sends his disciples out on mission, he is conscious they may be afraid to speak out. Three times he urges them in the gospel not to be afraid. Today's readings may be an opportunity for us to identify our fears and to confront them.

## A reading from the book of Jeremiah 20:10-13

Jeremiah said:

I hear so many disparaging me, ‘  
“Terror from every side!”  
Denounce him! Let us denounce him!’  
All those who used to be my friends  
watched for my downfall,  
‘Perhaps he will be seduced into error.  
Then we will master him and take our revenge!’  
But the Lord is at my side, a mighty hero;  
my opponents will stumble, mastered,  
confounded by their failure;  
everlasting, unforgettable disgrace will be theirs.  
But you, Lord of Hosts, you who probe with justice,  
who scrutinise the loins and heart,  
let me see the vengeance you will take on them,  
for I have committed my cause to you.  
Sing to the Lord,  
praise the Lord,  
for he has delivered the soul of the needy  
from the hands of evil men.

## Responsorial Psalm Ps 68:8-10, 14, 17, 33-35

**R.** Lord, in your great love, answer me.

It is for you that I suffer taunts, that shame covers my face, that I have become a stranger to my brothers, an alien to my own mother’s sons. I burn with zeal for your house and taunts against you fall on me. **R.**

This is my prayer to you, my prayer for your favour. In your great love, answer me, O God, with your help that never fails: Lord, answer, for your love is kind; in your compassion, turn towards me. **R.**

The poor when they see it will be glad and God-seeking hearts will revive; for the Lord listens to the needs and does not spurn servants in their chains. Let the heavens and the earth give him praise, the sea and all its living creatures. **R.**

## First Reading

There was a No. 1 pop song in 1971 called *Joy to the World* which began with the line: *Jeremiah was a bullfrog!* This reading captures both these aspects. It begins with Jeremiah’s anguished lament at the ridicule and persecution he is suffering. But then it changes into his powerful testimony of trust in God, ending in joy with the acclamations: *Sing to the Lord, praise the Lord.* The reader should make a clear distinction between the two parts. The first part is emotional; it has Jeremiah quoting the words of others. A different pitch will help delineate the different speakers. The second part is mostly positive – Jeremiah is conscious that God is at his side, and he states that he is committed to his God-given cause. However, there are some ominous overtones as he looks forward to God’s vengeance, bringing about failure and disgrace to his opponents. The idea of God punishing the wicked is common in the Old Testament (this is justice) but it does not sit well with our understanding of a God of compassion and mercy.

## Responsorial Psalm

Psalm 68/69 is cited by a number of New Testament writers in reference to Jesus’ passion and death. The selected verses follow the pattern of the Jeremiah reading – first a lament at persecution, then a beautiful prayer of trust in God’s help, God’s love and compassion especially for the poor.

Singing the response together and hearing the proclamation of the cantor/reader will nourish the faith of the assembly. Whenever we are in need, we pray and ask for God’s help. The psalm reassures us that God’s listening ear, his unfailing kindness and love will see our hearts revived. Praise the Lord!

Six-line verses are unusual. Take care with cues for the assembly’s response.

**A reading from the letter of St Paul to the  
Romans**

**5:12-15**

Sin entered the world through one man, and through sin death, and thus death has spread through the whole human race because everyone has sinned. Sin existed in the world long before the Law was given. There was no law and so no one could be accused of the sin of 'law-breaking', yet death reigned over all from Adam to Moses, even though their sin, unlike that of Adam, was not a matter of breaking a law.

Adam prefigured the One to come, but the gift itself considerably outweighed the fall. If it is certain that through one man's fall so many died, it is even more certain that divine grace, coming through the one man, Jesus Christ, came to so many as an abundant free gift.

**A reading from the holy Gospel  
according to Matthew**

**10:26-33**

Jesus instructed the Twelve as follows: 'Do not be afraid. For everything that is now covered will be uncovered, and everything now hidden will be made clear. What I say to you in the dark, tell in the daylight; what you hear in whispers, proclaim from the house-tops.

'Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; fear him rather who can destroy both body and soul in hell. Can you not buy two sparrows for a penny? And yet not one falls to the ground without your Father knowing. Why, every hair on your head has been counted. So there is no need to be afraid; you are worth more than hundreds of sparrows.

'So if anyone declares himself for me in the presence of men, I will declare myself for him in the presence of my Father in heaven. But the one who disowns me in the presence of men, I will disown in the presence of my Father in heaven.'

**Second Reading**

Sin, death, law, grace. Theologians have been probing these questions for centuries! Helpfully for us, Paul takes the law out of the equation. His link between sin and human mortality comes from the Book of Genesis: *you are dust and unto dust you shall return* (Gen 3:19).

Christ is sometimes called 'the second Adam' – the relationship is one of contrast. Adam's disobedience brought sin and death into the world; Christ takes human frailty upon himself and, by obedience to God's will, conquers death and reconciles humanity with God. God's powerful gift of grace (seen in the resurrection of Christ) brings us the forgiveness of sin and the promise of eternal life.

The rupture brought by Adam is healed by Christ. This contrast should be the main focus for the reader. The term 'man' should not be changed in order to highlight this message.

**Gospel**

A fearless proclamation from the housetops, making clear what is hidden, whispered or secret... no wonder the disciples might be afraid to be sent on such a challenging mission!

There may be consequences, but we do not face them alone. The basis of Jesus' exhortation not to be afraid is God's abiding providence. God knows every sparrow and every hair on your head! God will stand by you, whatever happens.

This is followed by Jesus' reassuring affirmation that those who stand up for him will in turn have Christ to speak for them before God. The converse, however, which Jesus throws down as a warning at the very end of the reading, is a real challenge. It should be read more quietly than the previous sentences.

The reader should convey the positive message that there is no need to be afraid; we can be bold as we undertake our mission of living and proclaiming the gospel.

May almighty God bless us in his kindness  
and pour out saving wisdom upon us.

**Amen.**

May he nourish us always with the teachings of the faith  
and make us persevere in holy deeds.

**Amen.**

May he turn our steps towards himself  
and show us the path of charity and peace.

**Amen.**

And may the blessing of almighty God,  
the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit,  
come down on us and remain with us for ever.

**Amen.**
